C. W. Everett Buried Here

Sorrow found its way into many hearts last Wednesday morning when it was learned that the grim hand of death had snatched from the midst of his family and this community, C. W. Everett, one of our progressive citizens. Mr. Everett was a vigorous and robust man, and was ill only two days.

He had been enjoying good health and his death came as a distinct shock to his family and friends. The cause of his demise was neuralgia of the heart, caused from hardening of the arteries. In his passing this community loses one of the best known and generally beloved men of the community, one who had won a host of friends by his strong character and readiness to assist a friend or neighbor. Mr. Everett was endowed by nature with a disposition that made him a favorite figure among all with whom he came in contact. He held a kindly attitude toward life and met its joys with an appreciative heart and its vicissitudes with a cheerful optimism, always actively identified with every movement that meant for the progress of the community.

He was born June 30, 1886, to Warren and Mattie Everett at Lyons, Nebraska, and attended grade and. high school at Lyons and lived there until 22 years old. He was married to Miss Emma Zimmerman of Bancroft on September 10, 1908, and remained at Lyons two years residing on a farm near there, later moving to a farm near Bancroft, where they lived for seven years. From here they went to western Nebraska, locating at Potter, and for nearly five years had charge of a hardware store. Later he traveled for a hardware company with headquarters at McCook. The family came to Carroll in 1925, where he became manager and later a partner in the Everett & Scace hardware and furniture business.

Four children were born to this union, Esther, now deceased, Harold Russell, Clyde Warren and Homer Dean. Besides his wife and three sons, he is survived by his mother, Mrs Mattie Everett and two sisters, Mrs. H. S. Scace of Wayne and Mrs. R. E. Bills of Omaha. His father, Warren Everett, preceded him in death fourteen years ago.

The funeral was held last Thursday afternoon with services at the M. E. Church with Rev. David Simpson, in charge and was one of the largest ever held in this city. A profusion of .beautiful flowers bespoke in their silent way, the sympathy for the bereaved family. A double quartette rendered beautiful music. Interment was made at Lyons, Nebraska, the cortege leaving immediately following the services here.
