E.B. Everett Passes Away

E. B. Everett, age 67, and for 64 years a resident of Lyons, passed away at his home Tuesday afternoon, following an illness of more than a year's duration from heart trouble.

Mr. Everett engaged principally in farming and cattle business, and for years operated one of the largest farms in this section.

He was a good father, friend and neighbor, and his loss will be keenly felt by those who knew him intimately.

Edward Burton Everett, youngest son of Franklin and Clara Everett, was born January 13, 1866, in Alamakee county, Iowa, and passed away at his home in Lyons, March 29, 1932, at the age of 67 years, two months and 16 days.

When he was three years of age the family moved to the old Everett home two miles north of Lyons, and this was his home the greater share of the time until he moved to town, 27 years ago.

He was united in marriage to Mary A. Piper, March 11, 1886, and to this union seven children were born. Three sons died in early childhood. Mrs. Everett passed away April 2, 1923. He leaves to mourn his demise three daughters and one son; they are Mrs. Margaret O'Connor, Lucy Everett, Mrs. Nellie Newill, and W. Burton Everett, all of Lyons. Three grandchildren, Edward O'Connor, Ronald Newill and Burton Everett, two brothers, Fremont of Willamina, Oregon, and Walter Everett of Los Angeles, California, besides a number of other relatives, survive.
