G. A. BEARDSLEY DEAD; PROCESSOR OF FOODS

Head of Shredded Codfish Firm an Ex-Official of East Orange

EAST ORANGE, N. J., Nov. 8—George A. Beardsley, president of the J. W. Beardsley's Sons, Inc., of Newark, manufacturers of shredded codfish and other fish and food products, died here today at his home. 139 Prospect Street. His age was 66.

The shredded codfish process used by Mr. Beardsley's firm was discovered by his father, the late Justin W. Beardsley. George A. Beardsley traveled frequently to his company's fish-

ing posts in the North Pacific and North Atlantic and to its curing stations on the island of Anacortes in Puget Sound. He was educated in Germany and moved when a young man to East Orange, where he was a member of the Police Commission from 1935 until his re-

tirement in August.

Mr. Beardsley was a big-game hunter. He owned a home in Lyme, Conn., said to be the second oldest dwelling in that State.

He leaves a widow, Mrs. Florence Amanda Beardsley; three sons, George A., Jr., Edward S. and Ensign Leonard Beardsley; a sister, Mrs. Augustus Harlow, and four grandabildan four grandchildren.
