## J. SHUMWAY DIES; AGE 94

Jeremiah Shumway, "being old and full of days," pased to his eternal Reward, Friday, Novem-ber 25th. He was born October 15th, 1827 at Oxford, Massachusotts on the old Peter Shumway farm, and there grew to manhood. At the age of fourteen he was cmployed at a salary, of \$50.00 per year with privilege of attending school three months during the winter, and at the age of nineteen years took up and learned the ear penter trade, receiving \$5.00 pemonth and his board. On July 24 1852 he was married to Mar; Maria Paine who was born in But riville, R. I. and to this union eigh children were born. In 1854, two

years after his marriage, he with his wife and four relatives lef their native home for the West traveling by stage as far as the Mississippi River, by boat to Lane ing; Iowa, then by ox team to Iluston County, Mintiesota, where. he and his family settled on a squatter's claim of 150 acres and resided until the year 1881, when they disposed of their Minnesot: land and moved to Lyons, Nebras ka. During his residence in Mirnesota he passed through the hartimes and "wild-cat money" o 1857 and also the uprising of th Sioux Indiana in 1862 at which time his wife and children wersent east to the Mississippi Rive for safety. In 1864 he enlisted i Co. A 5th Minnesota Regiment and participated in the hattles o Nashville under General Thomas the subsequent pursuit of Hood's Army, and in the Capture of Mo bile, serving until the close of the war. On settling in Lyons he en gaged in the lumber, farm machinery and coal business which with his sons 'he continued during his life time. He was a member of the Methodist church for over fifty years and contributed much linaucial aid and assistance in the building of our home church and

in its necessary maintenance and rupport. He was always an active member of the G. A. R. Pos at Lyons and for many years it commander; in 1908 he was honored with the apointment as colone' on the Staff of the Department Commanders by Governor Mickey His wife departed this life Aug nst 19, 1898 and since that time two of his sons, H. P. Shumway and Edmund E. Shumway have passed away so that Mr. Shumway left surviving him five children thirty-one grand children and twenty-four great grand children. The funeral services, were held Eunday afternon at the M. E. church under the direction of the G. A. B. Post, the American Legion and the Woman's Relief Corps with Rev. Webster of Omaha, Mr. Shumway's former pastor and who also had conducted the funeral services of Mrs. Shumway, officiating, the scripture lesson being from the Second Chapter of Second Kings.
